

- Turnout of SLSA nominations increased from 121 in 16/17. (COMPLETE 455, a 276% increase)
- Turnout of SLSA nominations increased from 455 in 17/18. (NOT COMPLETE 275, a reduction of 40% on last year, but +56% on 2016/17).
- Satisfaction with academic representation increased from record-breaking **4.87% above** the sector average in 17/18.
